Non-metastatic

- ☐ What can I do to manage my symptoms?
- ☐ Do I need to continue to monitor my prostate cancer even if I’ve had surgery and/or radiation or am on treatment? Why is that important?
- ☐ If my prostate-specific antigen (PSA) level is not rising, do I still need to monitor my prostate cancer?
- ☐ What do the results of my recent test(s) mean? Do I need any additional tests?
- ☐ What might a rapidly rising PSA level mean for my prostate cancer?
- ☐ What can we do to prepare in case my prostate cancer progresses in the future?
- ☐ What is the risk of my cancer spreading?
